ANNUAL REPORT 2021- 2022

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Executive Summary

This document presents an overview of ASHA Foundation's activities from April 2021 to March 2022.

The year opened on a bleak note with the continuance of the Covid 19 pandemic.

Covid work:

This year ASHA Foundation was able to provide dry rations to 177 families during the peak period of the Covid pandemic. The rations were given to all poor families who were suffering due to the Covid 19 pandemic. We are grateful to Ripples of Kindness from USA, who, through the kind offices of the Overseas Women Club, and to Stichting Kettingreactie, Netherlands for providing the funds for these rations.

Online programs for children on awareness on Covid 19 were continued this year also. Dr. Glory was involved in various webinars on Covid 19 during this financial year also which included a panel discussion on Covid 19 for 300 employees from LinkedIn, awareness sessions on Covid-19 to the volunteers of ASHA Foundation, and to almost 200 Pre university students from Loyola College.

The five service projects of ASHA Foundation continued but were impacted by Covid 19 pandemic as described below:

HIV Counseling and Testing Services

Since inception, there have been almost 33,329 telephone counseling calls, more than a 1000 email queries and almost 10,000 counseling sessions, of which this period accounted for:

- ➤ 1889 telephone counseling calls.
- > 590 counseling sessions.

This year only one awareness programs could be conducted due to covid-19 restrictions.

The Adolescent Health Education Project:

This year no teachers' training program could be held due to Covid 19. Slowly as schools reopened the AHE programs were restarted in the schools and by the end of the year 492 schools, 4 colleges

and 1 other institution were implementing the curriculum and overall about 46,136 students are now doing the program. In May 2022, though it does not fall in this financial year, a Teachers' training workshop was conducted in Dimapur, Nagaland under the Kohima Diocese and 110 teachers from 56 schools in Nagaland attended and already 34 schools have started implementing the program with 2601 students doing the program which is not included in the above numbers.

The Children-at-Risk Project

This project supports HIV-infected and affected children and HIV positive men, women and families. Free medical care and consultation is provided for all the HIV positive patients, including children. The services include routine medical care, treatment for opportunistic infections, counseling services, socio-economic assessments, free or subsidized Antiretroviral Treatment (ART), free or subsidized costs for investigations, empowerment of women through Self Help Groups, and educational and nutritional support for HIV infected and affected children. This year, 68 children received support for education and there were 2844 patient visits to the free HIV clinic. No SHG meetings, no picnic and no annual sports day could be held due to the pandemic this year.

The Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission (PMTCT) of HIV Project

HIV positive pregnant mothers are identified and treated so that their babies are born HIV negative. So far, more than 2,24,149 pregnant mothers have been tested for HIV under this project, of which 1069 were identified as HIV positive. The risk of transmission of HIV from mother to child has been reduced from 45 % to 1.7 % in our cohort. This year:

- ➤ 9743 pregnant mothers were tested for HIV, of which 31 were identified as HIV positive and treated and monitored.
- ➤ Twenty-one babies were born during the specified time period, 21 were tested for HIV, at 6 weeks and all were negative and 34 received final testing at 15 to 18 months and all were HIV negative.

Camp Rainbow Project

The Covid 19 pandemic impacted this project greatly. No residential camps or outreach programs could be held this year. However around 46 online programs were conducted during the year. Towards the end of the financial year three in person programs could be conducted, two leadership in

training programs for children living with HIV in the age group of 18 to 24 years and one caregiver session. Overall, a total of 3660 people have been influenced under this project, including campers, volunteers, adolescents, follow-up participants, caregivers, and staff who care for the children at orphanages.

Miscellaneous Activities

On world AIDS day, Dr. Glory gave information on HIV on FM Radio 93.5. There was also an awareness session for Christ University students and almost 500 of them attended. She was also part of an international panel discussion on therapeutic psycho social intervention for CLHIV on 2.12.2021, which was organized by Serious Fun Network and was viewed by staff from the thirty global camps in North America, Europe, Africa and Asia.

ASHA Foundation also partnered with the International AIDS Society to conduct a South Asia Regional Symposium that included the countries of India, Nepal, Srilanka, Maldives, Bhutan, Pakistan etc. The program was over two days on the 18th and 19th of March 2022 and received very good feedback.

Dr. Glory and a team of ten from ASHA Foundation also attended the International AIDS Conference at Montreal, Canada from the 29th of July 2022 to the 2nd of August 2022 but more about that in next year's annual report.

The research projects continue on schedule.

During this period, ASHA staff conducted 60 training programs and attended 26 training programs.

The Board of Trustees of ASHA Foundation had regular quarterly meetings.

ASHA Foundation would like to place on record their gratitude to the Board of Trustees, the Research Advisory Board, long-standing supporters Mr. Krishna Chivukula and Indo-MIM Ltd. This report is for the period April 2021 to March 2022. The following projects were continued during the financial year:

- 1. The HIV/AIDS counseling services including the AIDS Helpline and Telephone Counseling service.
- 2. Adolescent Sexual Health Education Project named Anmol Ashayein.
- 3. The Children at risk project.
- 4. The Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission of HIV project.
- 5. Camp Rainbow Project.
- 6. Research projects- Research is integrated into every project and maybe scientific, operational, or social sciences research.

1. The AIDS Helpline and Telephone Counseling service and integrated counseling and testing service

The ASHA Foundation HIV/AIDS helpline was one of the first helplines started in the country in 1998. In the year 2011 the IVRS system was discontinued but the manual helpline which was started in the year 2000 continues till date.

HIV/AIDS helpline service and integrated counseling and testing service is one of the projects of ASHA Foundation which focuses on providing counseling to HIV patients, their families and their community. There are two manual helpline which functions on 5 days of the week from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm. It also aims at enhancing adherence to treatment and, to improve their quality of life. In addition to telephone counseling, face to face counseling is also available. ASHA Foundation is located in the urban district of Bangalore. ASHA Foundation introduced the manual telephone counseling line for HIV/AIDS in the year 2000. The project is now in its twenty first year.

Goal:

- 6. Research

- (ii) To conduct 3 HIV/AIDS awareness session per year
- (iii)To increase the number of telephone calls by 5%
- (iv) To increase our publicity through advertisements in newspapers & poster

2. Adolescent Health Education

Adolescent Health Education is one of the projects of ASHA Foundation which was launched in the year 2000. The project involves the empowering of adolescents so that they can face the challenges of their future. The project started with the empowering of students in the area of preventing HIV/AIDS which was a threat to adolescents. As years passed on other challenges of smoking, substance abuse, alcoholism and suicide ideation, negative impact of social media, bullying have become a source of threat.

The strategy involves empowering adolescents with life skills and build character in the school going years. Therefore the people involved in the program are Institutions, school leadership, teachers, parents, students and ASHA Foundation.

This program trains teachers in a three- day workshops. The strategy is to train teachers who would facilitate this process for their students in their schools. Volunteers and others have done this for out of school youth too.

These teachers go back to their schools and in consultation with the school leadership implement the program in their schools. To make this value teaching realistic there is a peer and parent component. The guideline for this is provided to the teachers at the teachers' training workshop. Each lesson has its peer and parent's component.

The value teaching is structured to help children walk the talk not only for teenage years but these skills are learnt for life.

In the year 2021-2022, a total of 3400 teachers had been trained, 492 institutions were conducting the AHE program and around 46,136 students were using the curriculum.

During the two years of the covid pandemic, the AHE program could not be conducted in its entirety. However in the financial year 2021-2022, the schools started reopening and many schools started redoing the program.

Particulars of our program.

- The Goal is to empower adolescents to face the challenges of their day
- The Strategy to have teachers transact a curriculum which helps adolescents live up to their ideals
- Teachers are trained in a three-day workshop which would help them to implement the curriculum in their schools.

- Once the curriculum is implemented the Adolescent Health Education team members will follow up the work being done at the school.
- Caregivers for children / adolescents in out of school situation have also been using the curriculum

ASHA Foundation has been training teachers since 1998 and have conducted 69 teachers Training Workshops so far. The number of trained teachers was 3461, students who were doing the program online were 46136 in the year 2021-2022.



The CAR project supports the medical, nutritional and educational support for children infected and affected by HIV/AIDS.

The following activities were undertaken: -

To improve the educational status of children infected and affected by HIV/AIDS:

As the part of the educational support, during the period, 68 children were supported for their education. Details as follows,

To improve the health status of the children infected and affected by HIV/AIDS and their families:

HIV Testing

During the period, totally 32 HIV tests have been done including testing on 29 children. Out of this 05 have been reported positive, of which 03 adults - male 01 and female 02, and 01 male child and 01 female child.

HIV/AIDS Clinic

Children:

ASHA Foundation conducts a HIV/AIDS clinic thrice a week on Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays afternoon from 1.30 pm to 5.00 pm. Totally the clinic operates for 154 days. The medical team consists of Physician, Pediatrician, Counselors, Nurse, Project Coordinator, Medical Social worker and clinic support staff. Free Medical care and consultation is provided for all the HIV Positive patients and all children infected by HIV/AIDS. The services include routine medical care, treatment for opportunistic infections, counseling services, socio-economic assessment and free or subsidized Antiretroviral Treatment (ART).

Presently 46 children are receiving ART treatment out of which 37 are on the first Regimen, 6 are on the 2nd Regimen and 3 are on the 3rd Regimen and remaining 5 children are to be started on ART. All these children have increased CD4 Counts and their quality of life is good. Totally 487 children visits occurred to the clinic. 53 times children received CD4 investigation support and 27 times children have received support for various investigations like CBC, ESR, Hemoglobin, Complete Blood Count, S Creatinine, SGOT and SGPT and Routine Urine analysis.

Adults

Totally 290 adult patients are on ART. Three hundred and thirty six CD4 tests have been done and 448 general investigations were conducted. One hundred and sixty one viral loads were done.

To improve the Socio-economic status of the children and their parents infected or affected by HIV/AIDS

Self Help Groups: -

Six Existing Self-help Groups (117 members) are there which have been formed under the guidance of ASHA Foundation with an average of 18 to 24 members in each group. The six groups are: Shrishti, Trupti, Preethi, Prakruthi, Nisarga and Nesara. Regular meetings were not conducted due to COVID-19.

SHG Topics covered during the period as follows: -

Meetings were not conducted due to COVID-19

Dry Ration Support: -

One hundred fifty two families with children were supported with dry ration for three months and twenty-five families were supported for two months. Each package of dry rations consists of 5 kgs rice, 2 kgs Atta, half a kg green gram, 1 kg oil, half a kg Channa dhal, Toor dal 1kg, Sugar 1 kg, Jaggery half a kg, Ragi powder 3kgs, Tea powder 100gms, Chili powder 100gms, Haldi powder 100gms, Wheel soap 5pcs and Bathing soap 5 pcs.

Miscellaneous Information:

Over the years, ASHA Foundation has provided long term support for children infected and affected by HIV with free ART. Nutritional support, dry ration support and partial educational support. Some of these children have now completed their education and are working and supplementing their families' income. The table below shows details of these children.

Case study - 1

Pavitra comes from a HIV positive family. She, her husband and her two sons are all HIV positive. About sixteen years ago she came to us pregnant for the third time and said that "ASHA Foundation treats HIV positive pregnant mothers so that the baby is born HIV negative. Please do the same for this pregnancy also, so that I can have a HIV negative child. I want to have at least one HIV negative child in the family". So she was given all the requisite treatment and she gave birth to a third boy who was HIV negative. This boy, Ravi is today 16 years old and is currently pursuing his 1st year pre university in science. He is extremely intelligent and obtained 91% in his 10th standard. He wants to become an engineer. He has been partially supported by ASHA Foundation for his education. His mother and two brothers are also receiving free ART from ASHA Foundation since twenty years. One of the brothers is visually challenged and also bedridden. He had a stroke as a four year old and also had Tuberculosis of the brain as a child and he is left with a lot of disability. The oldest brother has finished his education and is now working as a billing operator at a restaurant and earning Rs.15000 per month. This case is being presented to show how through ART, one child in this family was saved from acquiring HIV and also ASHA Foundation's long term support to a family that includes ART, dry ration support, nutritional support and educational support till such time that the family can become independent, hopefully when this youngest boy finished his education and gets a good job to support his family fully.



4. The Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission of HIV Project (PMTCT)

Mother to Child Transmission (MTCT) is a major route for transmission of new HIV infections in children. MTCT contributes to about 4.5% of HIV infections in India. The Prevention of Parent to Child Transmission (PPTCT) programme is being implemented under NACP to achieve the goal of Elimination of Mother to Child Transmission (EMTCT). Children born to women living with HIV acquire HIV infection from their mother, either during pregnancy, labour/delivery or through breastfeeding which is largely preventable with appropriate intervention, by providing ART to mothers and ARV prophylaxis to infants . In 2020, 81,430 children are estimated to be living with HIV accounting for 3.5% of the estimated 23,18,738 PLHIV in India.

Nationally, in 2020, there were an estimated 20, 93,000 (15, 33,000–29, 08,000) pregnant women requiring ART to prevent MTCT of HIV. MTCT of HIV is a key commitment under the NACP. However, HIV estimation 2020 also showed that the progress on EMTCT, though significant, is still far from reaching the target. A significant achievement is evidenced by around 55% decline of annual new HIV infections among children between 2010 and 2020. The final MTCT rate (including breastfeeding period) in 2020 was estimated at 27.4% (20.3%–33.5%), down from around 40.2% in 2010.

ASHA Foundation is also involved in this project to identify and treat HIV positive pregnant woman in Bangalore urban and rural and nearby areas, as also in our partner hospitals. The PMTCT program has had a good impact in that over the last three years we have not had a single newborn child that has been HIV positive in all the newborns tested so far.

Goal: Elimination of new HIV infection among children

Objectives:

- To contribute to the WHO Global Goal of elimination of mother to child transmission of HIV (E-MTCT)
- To decrease the incidence of HIV infection in children born to HIV positive mothers from 45% to less than 5% in our project.
- To prolong the quality and quantity of life of the HIV positive pregnant mother so that she can take care of her infant and provide the child with a normal childhood as his right.

The target groups to whom the services are provided are:

- 1. All pregnant women attending antenatal clinics in our partner hospitals for routine HIV testing.
- 2. All pregnant women screened at other centers, accessed by outreach worker where PMTCT services are not available.
- 3. All identified HIV positive pregnant women in above two groups.
- 4. Infants born to HIV infected, by providing infant ARV prophylaxis, counseling on infant feeding practices, infant testing, immunization and co-trimaxozole prophylaxis.
- 5. Spouses of all HIV positive pregnant women.

This year, 9,743 pregnant mothers were tested for HIV till Mar 2022 in our partner hospitals. Of them, 31 were diagnosed HIV positive and started treatment. In addition, 21 HIV positive mothers delivered 21 infants and all 21 babies received treatment. Two mothers had abortion. Of the 24 babies who have been tested at six weeks, all are negative. Twenty five babies had 6 months antibody test and 26 babies had 12 months antibody test this year till March 18 and all tested HIV negative.

Our outreach worker contacted 20 new institutions (Maternity homes, Clinics etc.) and 1562 old institutions including Govt centers and 168 networks during this financial year to inform about ASHA foundations PMTCT programs and identify HIV positive pregnant women.

Our Outreach worker could not travel to multiple hospitals due to Covid 19. So telephone calls were made. Through her efforts we were able to register 21 patients in our programme.

The hospitals that have sustained the project on their own and are receiving only technological help, with financial support as needed for the care of HIV positive identified in their hospitals, IEC material and training of counselors are:

Case Study -1: Saraswathi has a rather sad past history. She is now 33 years old. When she was 18 years old she had an arranged marriage. One month later she discovered that her husband was already married and had a child also. So she left him and returned. Then 13 years later she got married again. (2020). In the year 2021 she got pregnant and was under the care of a hospital where her husband was an ambulance driver. Her husband is HIV negative and very supportive to her. As she had cephalo- pelvic disproportion (CPD) an elective caesarian section was fixed at 38 weeks of pregnancy and a HIV antibody test was positive. Unfortunately the mother could not have the benefit of ART. She delivered a male baby who was healthy at birth but three days later developed infection and was treated for the same. The baby was also given Syr. Nevirapine for twelve weeks. The mother gave exclusive artificial formula to the baby. The six week DNA PCR for the baby was HIV negative and he is now I year 3 months old and repeated HIV antibody tests are negative. This case is being presented to show that the risk of Transmission from Mother to Child in pregnancy is 45 % and that in 55% of cases the baby can be born HIV negative even if there is no treatment given to the mother. This case falls in that 55 % of cases where the baby is born HIV negative even without ART.

Case Study -2: Malini first came to us in December 2013 when she was seven months pregnant and diagnosed HIV positive. She had lost her first baby when that baby was one and half years of age due to a Kidney ailment. This was her second pregnancy. She received the requisite ART and other treatment and delivered a girl baby who is now 7 years old and HIV negative. After delivery of this girl baby she was lost to follow up and stopped her ART till she became pregnant again last year and came back to ASHA Foundation. Again she was started on ART and counselled on taking ART lifelong and she delivered in December 2021 a baby boy who is now 9 month old and HIV negative. She is doing well on treatment and her viral load is undetectable. Her husband is also HIV positive and is no treatment from Govt hospital. This case is being presented to show that inspite of our best efforts, patients stop taking their lifelong medication and stop coming for follow up also, but when she became pregnant she realized that she should start her treatment again and picked up the phone and called us.

5. Camp Rainbow project:

Camp Rainbow is a psycho-social program to provide opportunities for children living with HIV and other serious illnesses to participate in HIV education, traditional camp activities through the vehicle of residential and day camps. It aims at enhancing campers' adherence to treatment and medication, to improve their quality of life with the focus on primarily providing children with serious fun!

These structured psycho-social programs are in collaboration with the SeriousFun Children's Network, USA, started by actor Paul Newman. The SeriousFun Children's Network evolved from their year round camps in US and Europe to a Global Partnership Program serving children in Africa, Asia and South America.

2021 was the seventh year of Camp Rainbow Bangalore. In the past 6 years, 488 children have been served through Residential camps. About 1205 children, 413 caregivers have been served through outreach programmes that includes follow-ups and re-union programmes. Also 135 young adolescents have been part of the older adolescent programme so far.

2021 was another challenging year for the project. For the second consecutive year, residential camp was cancelled due to the pandemic of Covid -19, keeping in mind the best interests of everyone. However the online programmes for children and older adolescents continued. The sessions were mostly conducted through zoom or google meets and for some institutions where internet facility is a challenge, audio sessions were conducted.

The audio sessions were usually over telephone calls where the organizations connect their phones to the speakers and the children get to listen and interact over audio. While zoom calls are usually connected over laptop and sometimes displayed over big screen. Though these methodologies have it's own challenges, they have proven to be helpful when meeting in-person and conducting programmes has been tough.

The latter half of the year threw in some positivity. 3 in-person programmes were conducted- 2 Leaders' in training programmes and one caregivers' session were conducted at ASHA Foundation.

The children participated in the sessions were from the usual camper sending organizations. They were: ACCEPT CARE HOME-Bangalore, CALVARY CHAPEL BOYS' HOME- Bangalore, CALVARY CHAPEL GIRLS HOME- Bangalore and Tuticorin, DESIRE Society-Bangalore, FREEDOM FOUNDATION-Bangalore, SNEHA CARE HOME-Bangalore, INFANT JESUS CHILDREN'S HOME-Bangalore, SNEHALAYA CHILDREN'S HOME-Mandya, AMMA MANE-Mysore and some children from community.

Some of the topics covered were- Menstruation 101, Story-telling, time-management, handling social media, Covid-19 awareness etc. For the in-person programmes for youth, life-skills topics like managing stress, Peer pressure, communications skills etc.. were covered. A session on 'pre-marital information session' was conducted for the caregivers of HIV positive youth. The sessions are usually facilitated by the leadership team members and volunteers.

Also this year, a new topic was facilitated for the staff of positive networks. A session on 'Revealing HIV status for children' was conducted over zoom for Positive networks. The positive networks that participated in the sessions were from Chitradurga, Chikmagalur, Mysore, Mandya-Ramnagar, Tumkur, Kolar and Bangalore.

Though the Camp Rainbow Bangalore team was able to reach out to those children from Institutions and some children from community, it was still a big challenge to reach out to those children and youth who did not have any access to internet or phone.

Though these alternate programming methodologies are a boon, there is no replacement for the impact of in-person programmes. However, these audio and virtual programmes have provided an opportunity to reach out to campers and non-campers and provide them a learning and fun experience through new media.







Only 1 in 4 women in K'taka has knowledge of HIV/AIDS

Number Up From Previous NFHS Report

Bengaluru: Only 25% women in Karnataka possess comprehensive knowledge of HIV/AIDS, according to National Family Health Survey report of 2019-20. This, however, is way better than what was recorded in NPHS 2015-16, according to which just one in 10 women knew about it.

WORLD AIDS DAY

The improvement is in stark contrast to the data pertaining to men: 27% were found to have comprehensive knowledge about HIV/AIDS in both surveys.

Nationally, 21.6% women and 20.7% men have the know-ledge, up from 20.9% and 32.5%, respectively, in NFHS 2015-16. Going by the NFHS-5 report, Mizoram boasts of the highest figures —64% women



and 65.6% men have comprehensive knowledge about HIV/AIDS. The numbers for Manipurare 50.6% and nearly 60%, respectively.

Stigma associated with it

Senior officers in Karnataka State AIDS Prevention Society (KSAPS) say there is so much stigma attached to HIV/ AIDS that women would not want to talk about it even if they are aware.

"The NHPS data needs to be seen from the context of stigma associated with HIV/ AIDS. We don't agree with the data. Every pregnant woman in Karnataka is tested for HIV and is counselled about the same prior to testing. In 2019-20, 14.4 lakh pregnant women (104%) were tested for HIV, exceeding the target. A total of

HIV testing declines, thanks to pandemic

As per data with KSAPS, of the targeted 26.3 lakh persons to be tested for HIV in the state for 2020-21, exclusive of pregnant women, only 16.3 lakh (62%) underwent the test. "Testing among general public

has been hit due to the pandemic. Till October 2021, 12.5 lakh (48%) of the targeted 26.3 lakh persons were tested," said KSAPS officers. Testing among pregnant women has not seen any reduction.

623 were found positive," said KSAPS officials,

AspertheKSAPSdata, the number of pregnant women testing positive for HIV has gradually reduced.

"In 2013-14, 1,445 women were found positive during antenatal scanning. In 2018-19, the figure reduced to 706 and dipped further to 723 in 2019-20. As per the HIV sentinel surveillance data of 2019, the prevalence of HIV in Karnataka is 0.22%, slightly lower than than the country average of 0.24%," KSAPS authorities said.

According to Dr Glory Alexander, director, ASHA foundation and HIV/AIDS specialist, who has been working with marginalised groups, there is a possibility of tack of comprehensive knowledge about HIV, but everyone is aware of it. She said there are awareness campaigns to reach out to working women and homemakers.

'New infections, deaths dip'

"Everyone knows about the infection and how it spreads. New infections have come down. With novel drugs and antiretroviral therapy (ART) made available to all patients, the number of deaths has reduced and the quality of life has improved. We counsel the affected persons that HIV/AIDS is achronic but manageable illness, unlike the fataldisease it was earlier perceived to be "said Dr Alexander."

However, she added that awareness campaigns have taken a beating for nearly two years due to the pandemin.
